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Admission rules and selection procedure steps

for first-cycle graduates and graduates of master's studies in the same or related field in the field of Earth sciences:

1. Creating an account

The candidate creates an individual account in the Online Admissions System by providing the necessary personal data. Subsequent admission-related operations can only be made after logging in to the created account. All steps taken by the candidate after logging into the system are saved and archived. The candidate is obliged to keep the password to access the account secret.

2. Enrolling in the programme

The candidate chooses a programme/major and type of studies. It is recommended that the candidate thoroughly read the admission requirements for a given programme as well as the admission schedule.

3. Paying the enrollment fee

The candidate pays an admission procedure fee in the selected programmes/majors. Failure to pay the fee for a given programme means the candidate is not included in the selection procedure in this programme. The enrollment fee is PLN 85.

4. Attachment of documents obtained abroad

The candidate with the documents obtained abroad attaches scans of these documents for the purpose of their verification.

5. Complement of information about the diploma

The candidate enters information about the diploma: final grade on the diploma, diploma issuance date and diploma number.

6. Uploading a photo

The candidate uploads a high-resolution photo which will be used when generating the personal questionnaire. The photo of the admitted candidate will also be used in the student identification card.

Notice: if you do not upload a photo, system will not be able to generating the questionnaire!

7. Lodgment of all required documents by electronic means

Upon enrolling into the programme and paying the enrollment fee, the candidate is obliged to lodge of all required documents scans by electronic means within the specified time limit.

8. Taking the entrance examination

The candidate will receive a message via the Online Admissions System about the date, place and time of the entrance exam.

Failure to take the exam means the candidate is not admitted to the programme.

9. Final results of the selection procedure

The results of the selection procedure will be provided via the Online Admissions System. Upon logging into his/her account, the candidate will see information on admission or denial of admission.

List of necessary documents

The candidate must prepare for upload:

- photo file which will be used when generating the personal questionnaire
- a scan of university diploma
- a document confirming knowledge of English at B2 level
- English language command (B2 level, for the list of documents accepted as confirmation of English level see **FAQ section “language proficiency”**)

*Applicants who are citizens of the EU (including Polish citizens) and do not possess a document specified in the above regulation are required to take an online English language proficiency test.

Preparation of the documents

During the enrolment process, candidates do not submit any paper documents. Each of the required documents should be scanned to a separate file in PDF format. A document (e.g. certificate or diploma) that has more than one page should be scanned into one multi-page PDF file. Scanning documents can be carried out on its own with the use of a scanner or with the use of dedicated applications for devices with Android or iOS. The document scanning service is also available at most copy shops.

Attestation of documents

Document certification is a process in which a university employee confirms the conformity of attached document scans with their original (paper) versions.

Document certification involves presenting the original documents for inspection at the Student Office at the faculty immediately after the start of studies, but no later than: October 31 – for winter semester admissions, March 31 – for summer semester admissions, under penalty of initiating proceedings to remove the student from the list.

Documents obtained abroad

Candidates with documents obtained abroad also provide:

- a scan of a foreign document, which is legalized or accompanied by an apostille, entitling the candidate to take up higher education studies in the country where the document was issued (for the procedure of legalization of you document see **FAQ section “foreign diploma”**)
- a scan of translation of the document into the language of the studies undertaken by the candidate, performed by a sworn translator entered into the list of sworn translators maintained by the Polish Minister of Justice, or certified by a Polish consul in the country where the document was issued
- a scan of the document recognizing the foreign diploma as equivalent to the Polish diploma – in the case of candidates for second-cycle studies to whom this applies

- a scan of a document confirming the entitlement to study tuition-free – in the case of the foreigners concerned

How to obtain a diploma recognition statement

Diploma recognition is undertaken by NAWA. The information below is taken from the web-page link: [NAWA Polish National Agency for Academic Exchange](#) :

The NAWA's Director individual recognition statement on a foreign diploma confirming:

- completion of higher education
- award of an academic degree

is issued:

- after submission of the complete set of required documents in the SYRENA System – detailed information is available at the website Diploma of higher education,
- in a form of a digitally signed PDF document,
- in Polish,
- free of charge.

To obtain a recognition statement on a foreign diploma

- read the instructions given in the SYRENA - [User Manual below](#), before submitting the application. In the case of problems with opening the link to User Manual copy the following link to your browser:

- prepare scans of required documents - in PDF or JPG format, with maximum size of each file of 3 MB. Please pay attention to step 2 and step 3 described in the instructions to enter the document data correctly and attach properly:
 - diploma on which the recognition statement you wish to obtain
 - transcript of records / supplement / list of subjects and grades attached to the abovementioned diploma
 - previous document of education - document which was the basis for the admission to studies
 - transcript of records / supplement / list of subjects and grades attached to the previous diploma (if applicable)
 - translations of all the abovementioned documents (unless they are issued in: English, German, Spanish, Italian, Russian, Ukrainian, Belarusian). Translations should be done by a sworn translator.
 - identity card / passport
 - document stating the change of surname
 - in the case of refugees – a refugee status document
- fill in the application form and add scans of the required documents in the SYRENA System,

- to submit the application correctly click the individual activation link generated in the SYRENA System and sent to the e-mail address provided in the application form,
- check the status of your application in the SYRENA System at any time,
- download the individual recognition statement after receiving a notification sent via the SYRENA System.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

Programme

What is the Geohazards and Climate Change programme?

Geohazards and Climate Change is a second-cycle (Master's) degree programme taught entirely in English. It focuses on natural hazards, climate change processes, and their environmental and socio-economic impacts. The programme combines theoretical knowledge with practical and analytical skills.

Admission

Who can apply for this programme?

The programme is open to graduates of first-cycle (Bachelor's) studies or graduates holding a Master's degree in the same or a related field within Earth sciences or related disciplines.

Language

In what language are the studies conducted?

All courses, examinations, and the Master's thesis are conducted in English.

Language proficiency

How can I confirm my English language proficiency?

Applicants must demonstrate English proficiency at B2 level. EU citizens, including Polish citizens, who do not hold such a document are required to take an online English language test. Non-EU citizens applying from 1 August 2025 must submit one of the documents specified in the relevant national regulations, which include:

- University of Cambridge, ESOL Examinations:
 - B2 First (FCE),
 - C1 Advanced (CAE),
 - C2 Proficiency (CPE),
 - B2 Business Vantage (BEC Vantage),
 - C1 Business Higher,
 - Certificate in English for International Business and Trade (CEIBT),
- University of Cambridge, ESOL Examinations, British Council, IDP IELTS Australia: International English Language Testing System IELTS – at least 5,5 pkt:
 - Trinity College London:
 - ESOL Skills for Life – Level 1 (B2) or higher,
 - Integrated Skills in English (ISE) – ISE II or higher,
 - ISE Digital – more than 80 pkt (B2),
 - Educational Testing Service (ETS):
 - Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) version Internet-Based Test (iBT) – at least 72 points,

- Test of English for International Communication (TOEIC) – at least: 785 points at Listening & Reading and 150 points at Speaking and 160 points at Writing,
- Pearson Assessment English:
 - Pearson English International Certificate – paper or on-line (previously Pearson Test of English General (PTE) or London Tests of English) – Level 3 (Edexcel Certificate in ESOL International Level 1 – grade Pass, Merit, Distinction) or higher,
 - Pearson Test of English Academic (PTE Academic) paper version or online – at least 59 points,
- LanguageCert (PeopleCert Qualifications (PCQ)):
 - LanguageCert International ESOL – LanguageCert Level 1 Certificate in ESOL International (Listening, Reading, Writing) (Communicator B2), also named as: LanguageCert International ESOL Communicator B2 Listening, Reading, Writing or higher, together with LanguageCert Level 1 Certificate in ESOL International (Speaking) (Communicator B2), also named as: LanguageCert International ESOL Communicator B2 Speaking or higher,
 - LanguageCert Academic – LanguageCert Level 1 Certificate in ESOL International (Listening, Reading, Writing, Speaking) (LanguageCert Academic B2) or higher,
 - LanguageCert Test of English – LanguageCert Level 1 Certificate in ESOL International (Listening, Reading, Writing, Speaking) (LanguageCert Test of English B2) or higher,

Enrolment

What does the recruitment process include?

The recruitment process consists of an entrance interview conducted in English. The interview focuses on selected topics related to Earth sciences.

Interview

What are the admission interview requirements?

The interview is scored on a scale of 0–20 points. To pass the interview, candidates must obtain at least 12 points. Failure to reach the minimum score results in rejection.

Documents

What documents are required during recruitment?

Applicants are required to upload the following documents in the online recruitment system:

- a digital photograph,
- a scan of the higher education diploma,
- a document confirming English language proficiency at B2 level.

Foreign diploma

Do I need to recognise a diploma obtained abroad?

Applicants holding diplomas obtained outside Poland must upload scans of their diplomas and any required legalisation or apostille, as well as certified translations into the language of instruction. In some cases, confirmation of diploma recognition may be required. Diploma recognition is undertaken by NAWA. 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Documents format

In what format should documents be uploaded?

All documents must be uploaded as separate PDF files. Multi-page documents should be scanned and uploaded as a single multi-page PDF file. No paper documents are submitted during the recruitment process.

Results

Where can I check the recruitment results?

Final admission results are published in the Online Recruitment System. After logging in, candidates can view information on admission or rejection.

Duration

How long does the programme last and what degree is awarded?

The programme lasts two years and leads to the award of a Master's degree.
